The Office of Enforcement and Compliance Assurance (OECA) and the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) met on October 31, 2017, and have reached agreement on corrective actions for Recommendations 1 and 2, denoted as "Not in Agreement" in OECA's July 27, 2017, response to the above-captioned draft report. Additionally, the corrective action for Recommendation 3 has been edited. The Report should be edited to reflect the following agreed-upon Corrective Actions:
