The Office of Inspector General (OIG) for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) plans to begin fieldwork with objectives modified slightly from those in our November 5, 2018, project notification memorandum. This project is included in our fiscal year 2019 annual plan.

The OIG's fieldwork objectives are to answer the following questions:

- 1. What are the trends in enforcement results from fiscal years 2006 through 2018 for EPA-led enforcement actions?
- 2. What key factors explaining (a) enforcement result trends over time and (b) differences in enforcement result trends among EPA regions and environmental statutes?

The OIG plans to conduct work in the Office of Enforcement and Compliance Assurance (OECA) as well as the regions. The fieldwork will include analysis of environmental outcomes from enforcement actions and a survey of all agency enforcement staff and managers. We will conduct our work using applicable generally accepted government auditing standards. The anticipated benefit of this project includes providing an objective analysis of EPA enforcement trends.

We will contact you to arrange a mutually agreeable time to discuss our fieldwork objectives, the purpose of our project and preliminary results from our work to date. We would be particularly interested in any areas of concern that you may have. We will answer any of your questions about the project process, reporting procedures, and methods used to gather and analyze data. Throughout the project, we will continue to provide monthly email updates to the OECA Audit Follow-Up Coordinator and specified OECA managers.

We respectfully note that the OIG is authorized by the Inspector General Act of 1978, as amended, to have timely access to personnel and all materials necessary to complete its objectives. We will request

that you resolve the situation if an agency employee or contractor refuses to provide requested records to the OIG or otherwise fails to cooperate with the OIG. We may report unresolved access matters to the Administrator and include the incident in the *Semiannual Report to Congress*.

I will supervise the project, and the Project Manager will be Kathryn Hess.
